

News from the Head of School: Pauline Carmichael

We are now two thirds of the way through the school year – and what a year so far! As from March 5th March I accepted the position as permanent Head of School of Walton Hall School. I hope to keep you up to date with what is happening within the school through our termly newsletter.

Shaw Education Trust and Federation: As you know we talked with you at the end of last year, about Walton Hall School joining with Blackfriars and Coppice Federation of schools. We have delayed this process whilst we explore the other option which I wrote to you about recently - developing a partnership with a Charity called the Shaw Trust. The Shaw Trust is a national organisation with the remit of supporting disadvantaged and vulnerable young people into employment, supported employment and supported living. They are keen to work with schools and support students like ours earlier in the process than they do at the moment. The support they could offer our children and young people is guite staggering. They are keen to work with Blackfriars Coppice and Walton to form a Multi-Academy Trust. We are at the very early stages in discussions, but governors and colleagues across all three schools are very excited about the possibilities this collaboration would bring for our young people. As part of a potential relationship the Shaw Trust want to make an agreement that would guarantee all of our students and their families individual, bespoke support into the next phase of our children and young people's lives after they leave school. This would be a unique arrangement that would secure a much greater level of certainty for our students when they leave us. As I have said, we are at very early stages in the negotiations and there is a proper process that we need to follow if this moves forward. The team from the Shaw Trust have visited all sites and are very keen to meet with parents and carers. So, it is a case of watch this space.

News from the Head of School: continued.....

Ofsted: Our Spring term monitoring visit went very well, and we continue to make progress. The full report can be viewed on the school website. We will have, what will hopefully be our last monitoring visit, in the summer term. This is hoped to be an integrated inspection when both the education and residential provision will be inspected.

Parents Questionnaire: Many thanks to all of you who took the time to respond to this questionnaire. This has provided some very supportive and positive statements - thank you. I will keep you informed of the analysis of all the responses once all replies have been received. So far the comments range across the spectrum from strongly agree to strongly disagree. Some common themes which have been identified are 'Homework' and 'Information relating to child's progress' - we are currently in discussion as to how we are going to address this across the school. Once we have decided on a whole school policy I will keep you informed.

I was very surprised to see 'Bullying' identified as a concern by some parents. This is

something we take very seriously and respond to on a daily basis to ensure any friendship issues are addressed promptly. The incidence of bullying (persistent and targeted behaviour

towards an individual) in school is extremely low. Bullying is an agenda item at our weekly Safeguarding meeting. This enables us to monitor any trends in behaviours. Our Behaviour Manager works closely with individuals, parents and small groups of Some common themes which have been identified are 'Homework' and 'Information relating to child's progress'

students to resolve any friendship issues. I would encourage anyone having concerns to contact me and I will happily meet with you to explore and hopefully resolve your concerns.

Transport: As you are aware the Local Authority implemented changes to the transport earlier this year. Whilst some of these changes have improved circumstances for many students, they have also caused great distress and disruption to a few students and their families. This has also had an impact on behaviour of these individuals in school. Although the travel arrangements are between families and the local authority, as a school we have been in constant communication with representatives in the transport department to address the many issues these changes have caused. When individual parents have contacted us directly we have supported their concerns by speaking with and corresponding with representatives in the transport department to effect change. Our concerns were also raised as an agenda item with the IEB. The Chair of IEB has also written to Andrew Marsden, Head of School Organisation, Admissions and Transport to outline the disruption these changes have caused. She has been assured that these concerns will be considered. Hopefully, greater consultation with parents will be taken before any future changes are be made. We have a full calendar planned for the summer term - please check school bags for let-

ters / fliers and also our website.

Thank you for your continued support. I am excited to be working with you all and look forward to continue to move Walton Hall School 'onward and upward!'
